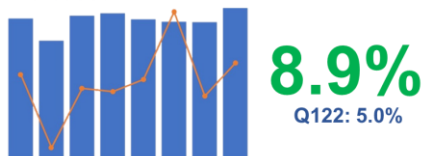

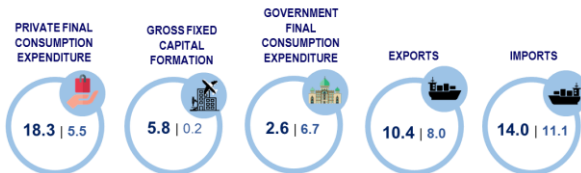

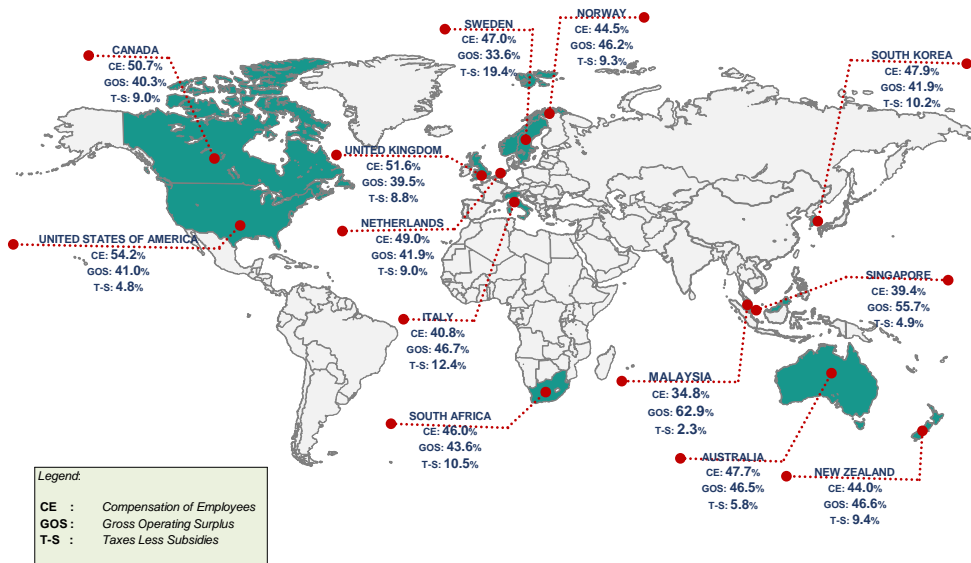

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT BY INCOME APPROACH FOR SELECTED COUNTRIES, 2021

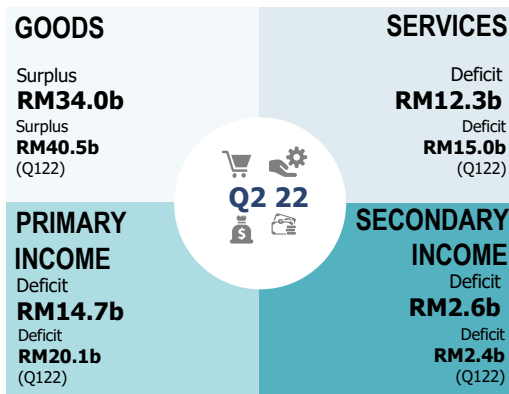

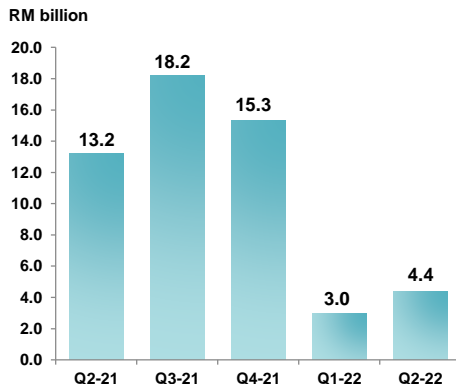

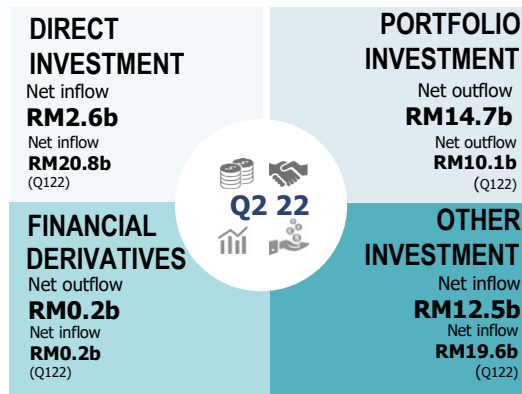

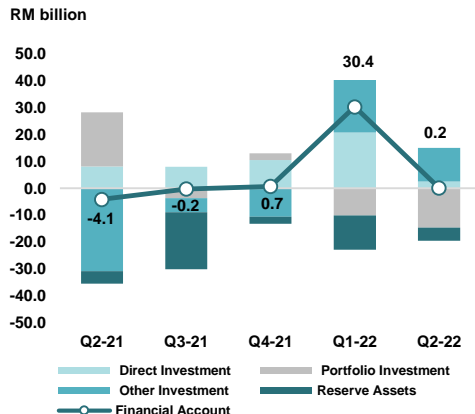
Current Account Balance, Q2 2021 – Q2 2022



“Financial account registered a net inflow of RM0.2 billion mainly contributed by Direct Investment and Other Investment”



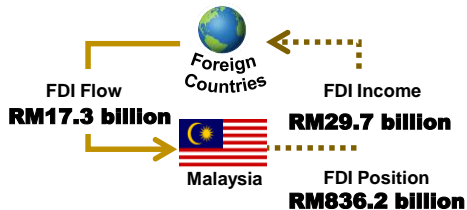
Financial Account, Q2 2021 – Q2 2022

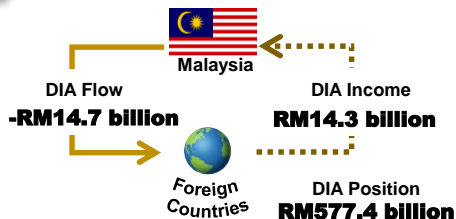

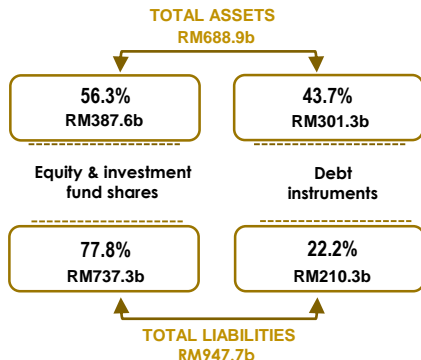

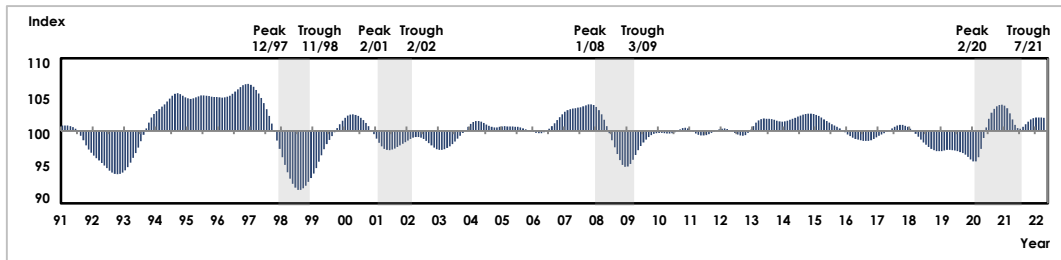

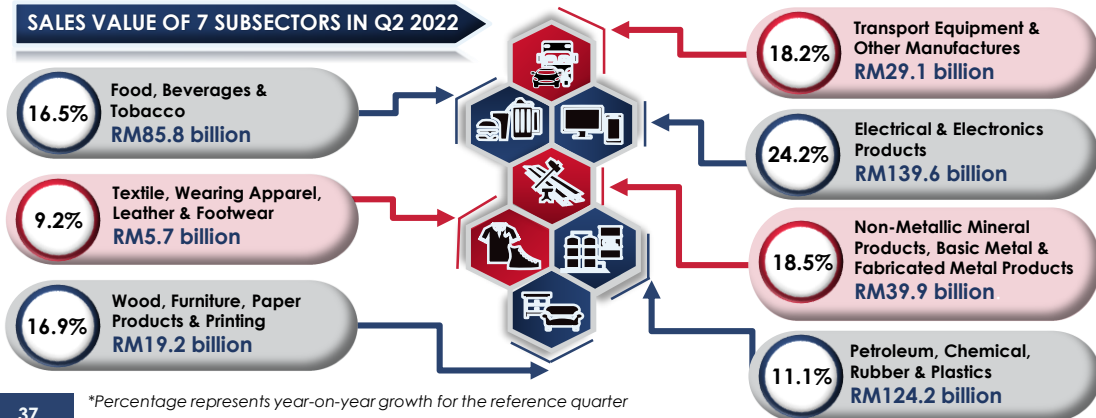

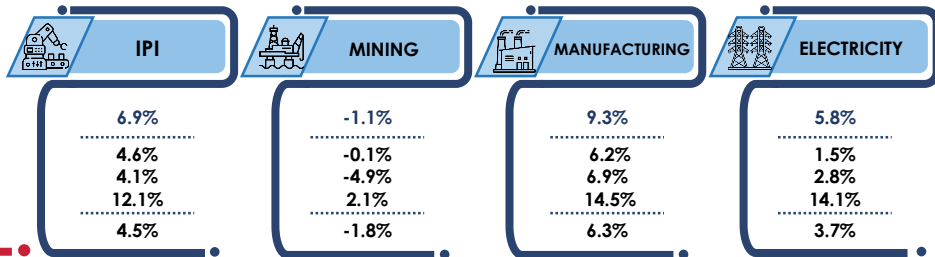


SALES VALUE OF 7 SUBSECTORS IN Q2 2022

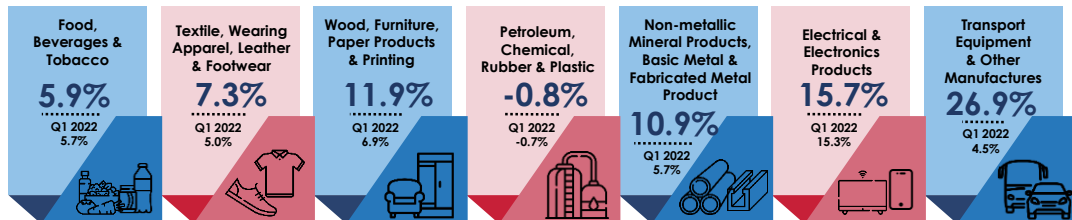

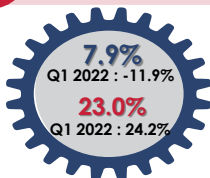

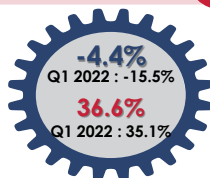

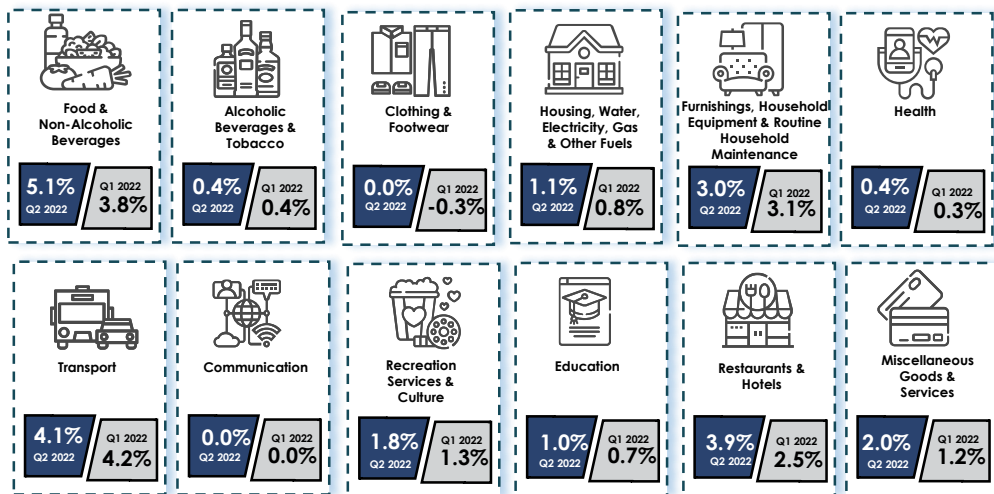

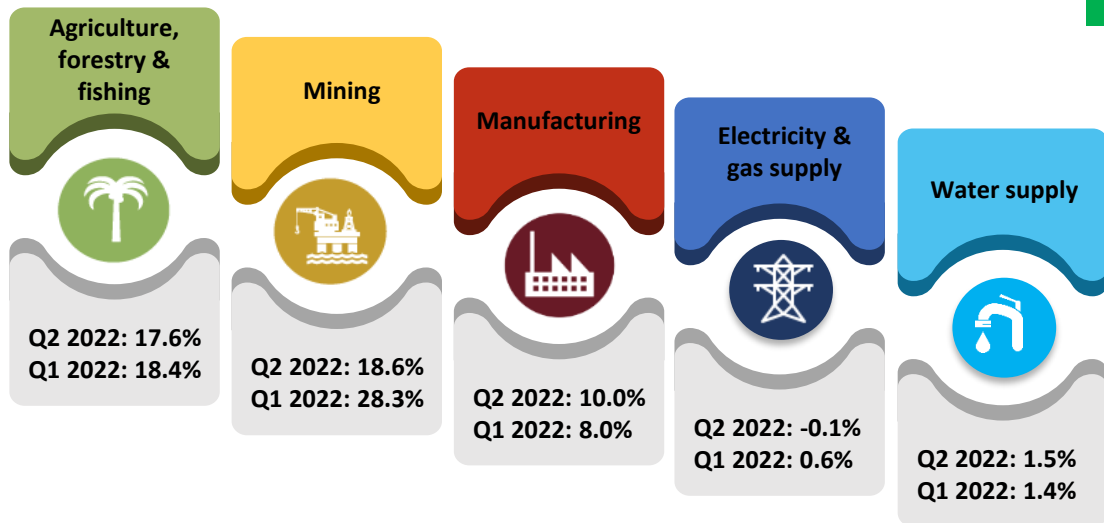

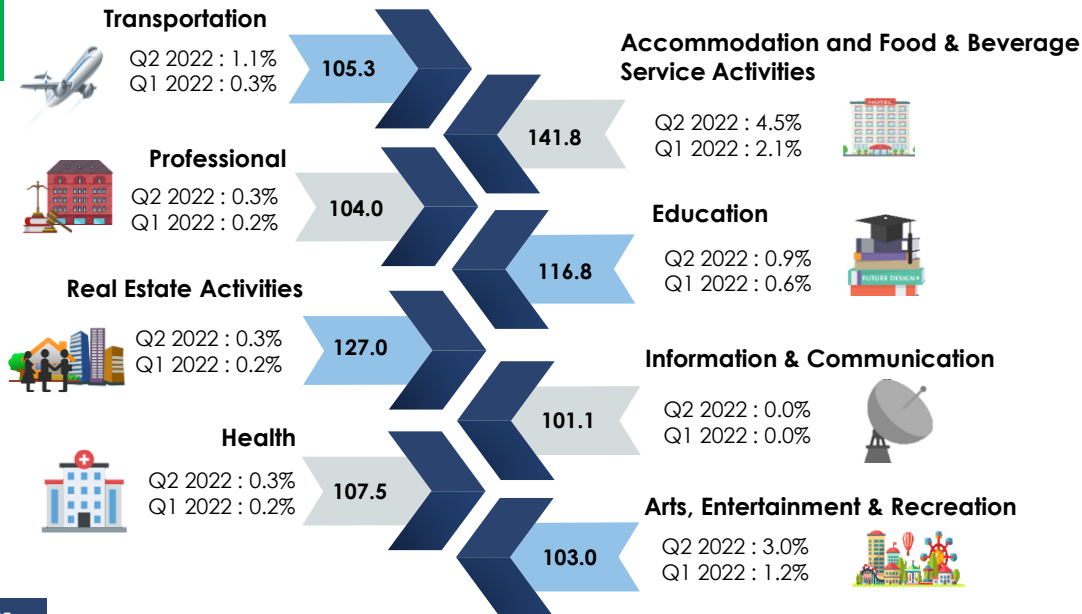
PRODUCER PRICE INDEX

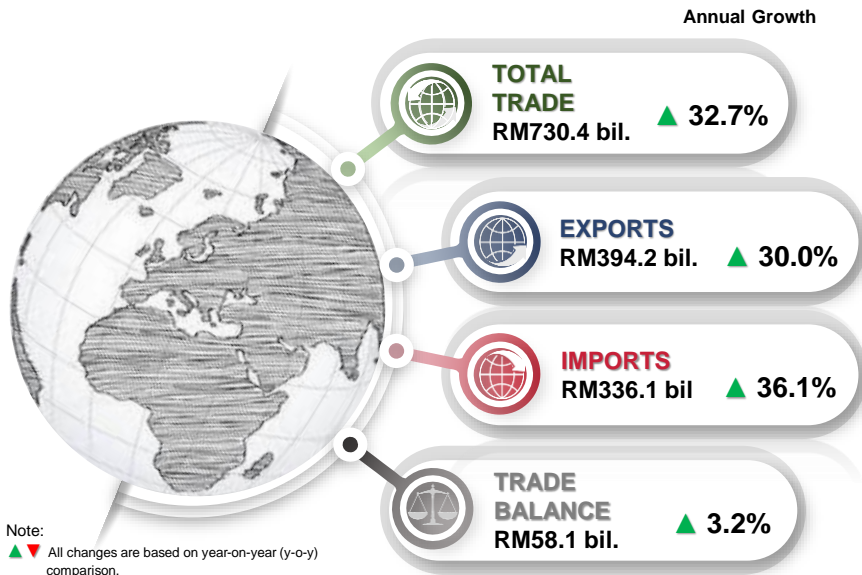

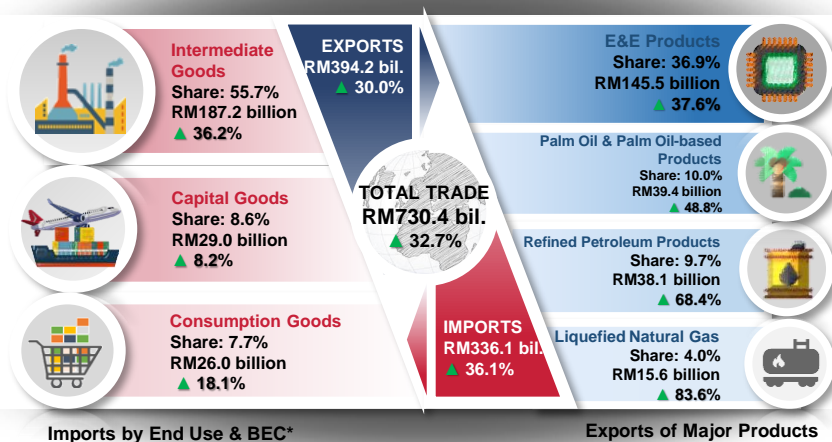

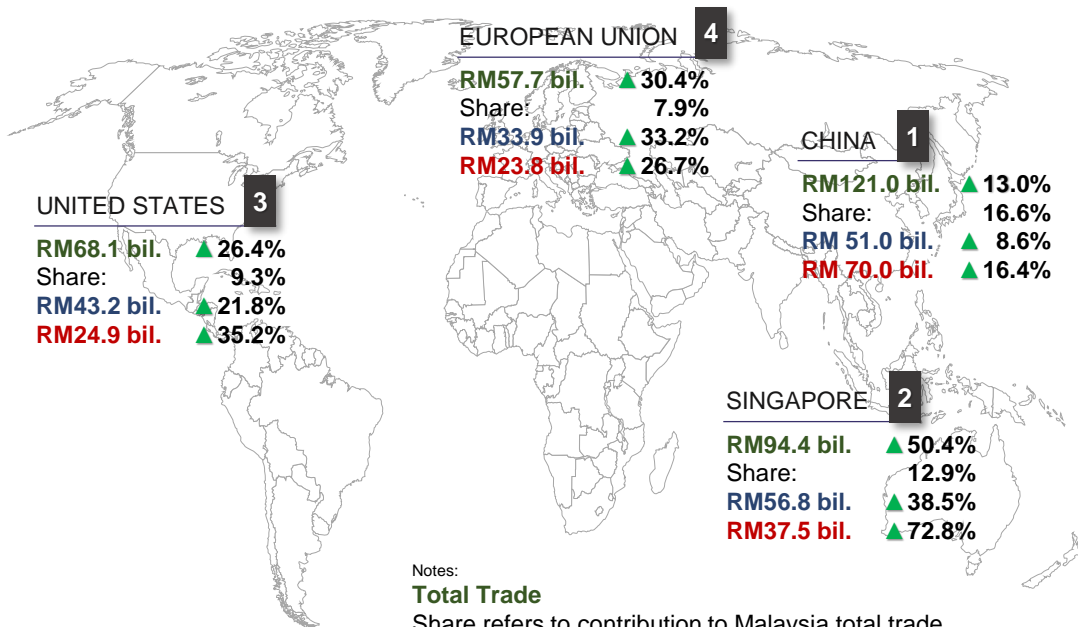

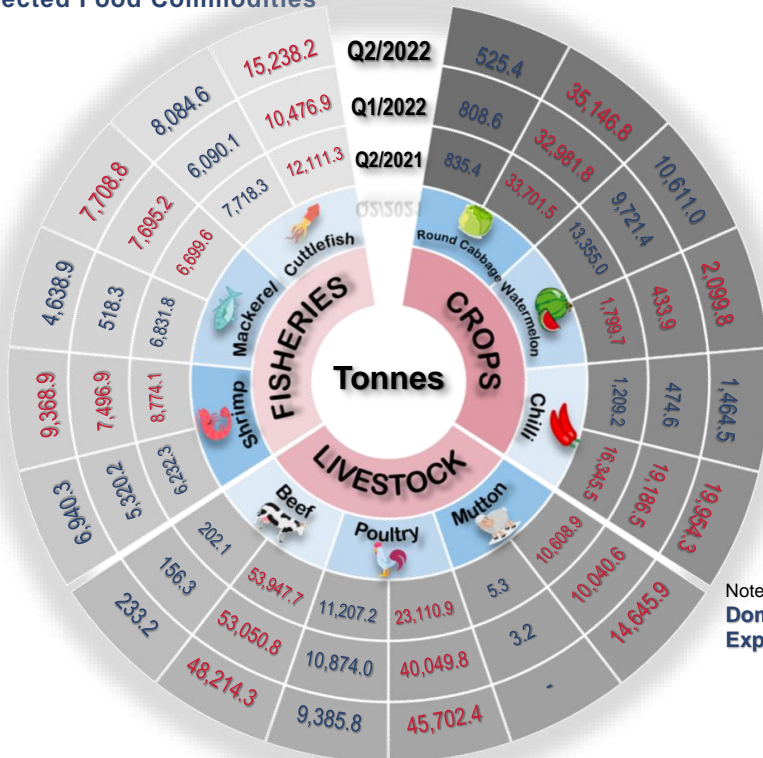

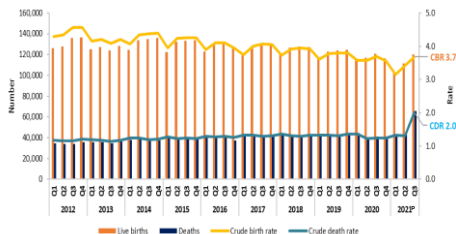

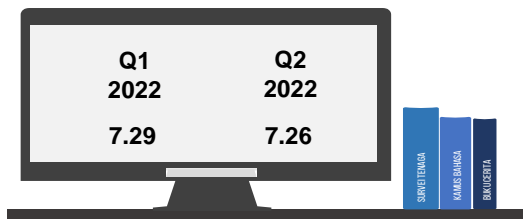

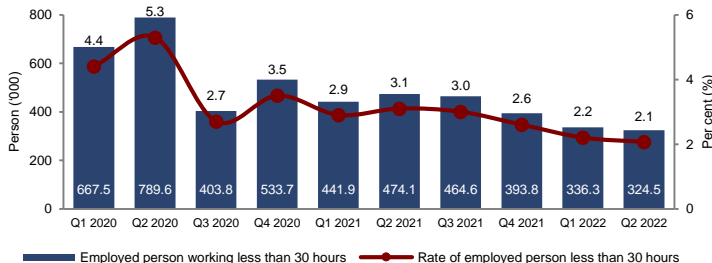

Employed Persons by Skill Level (%)



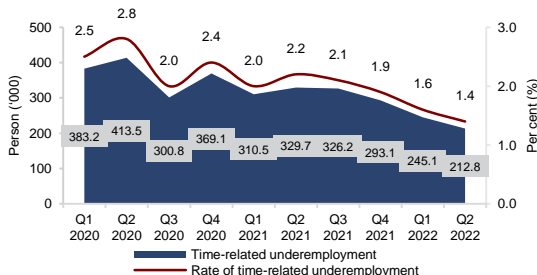

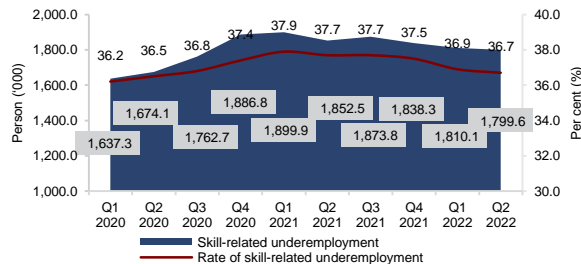

Skill-related underemployment



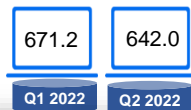

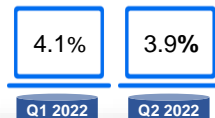

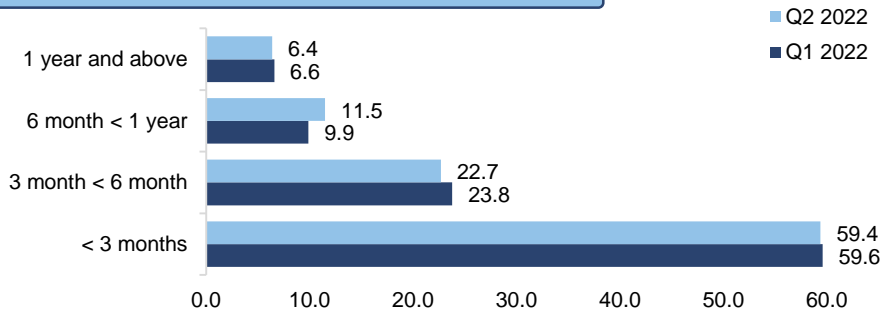

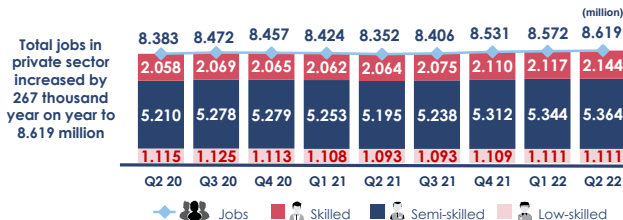

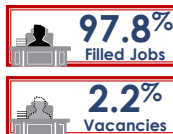

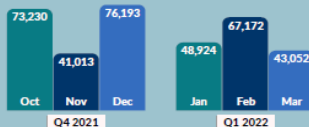

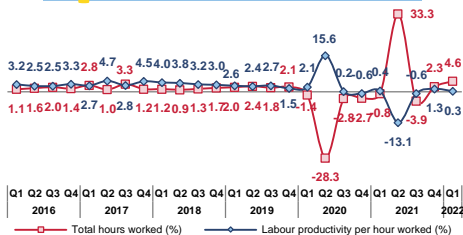

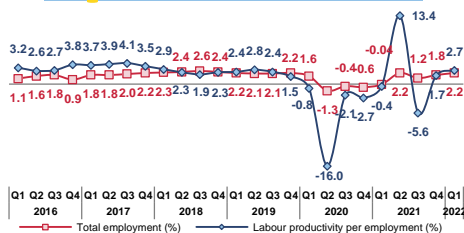

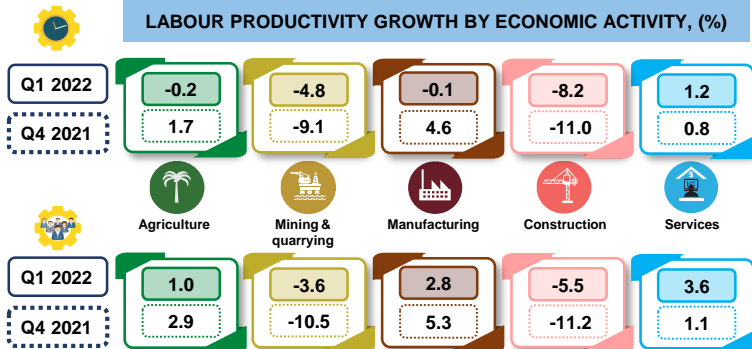
Labour Productivity per Hour Worked



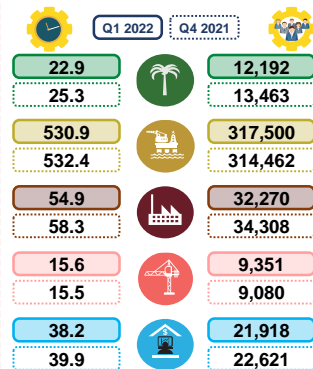
Labour Productivity per Employment

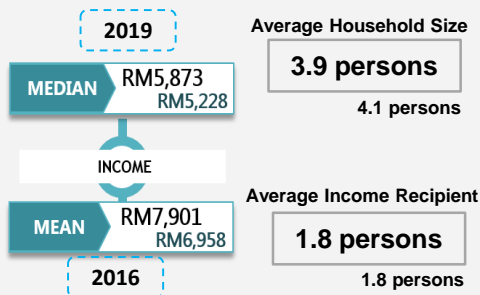

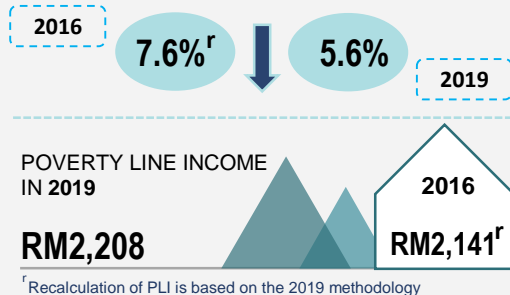

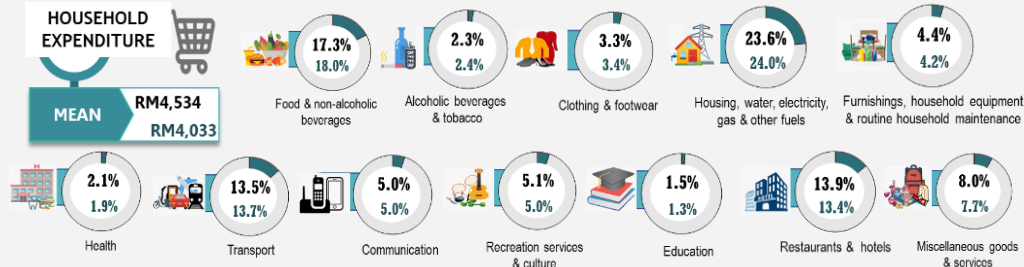

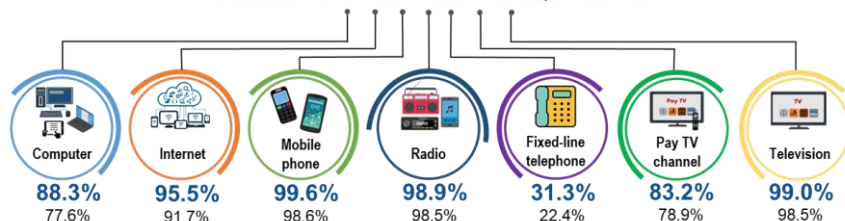

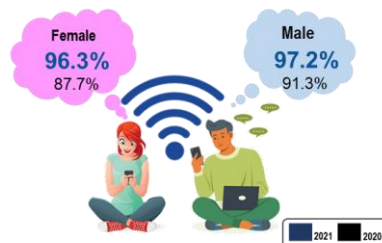

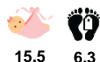

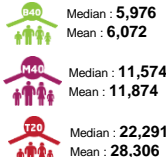
